





COVID RESTRICTIONS -UPDATED GUIDELINES

Weddings	Currently 50 guests are permitted to attend a wedding ceremony and reception. From Thursday 5 August, the maximum number of guests permitted to attend a wedding will increase from 50 to 100 (current protective measures apply).
Baptisms	From Thursday 5 August, Baptism services may proceed. However, they must follow all protective measures and social gatherings afterwards should be avoided.
Funerals	The number of mourners permitted at funerals continues to be limited to 50, regardless of size of venue. Attendance at wakes in private homes and at funeral homes is for family only. Related family gatherings should strictly adhere to prevailing public health advice on household mixing, including visitors to your home and indoor and outdoor dining

WEXFORD CYCLE 2021 -SATURDAY, 18TH SEPTEMBER

Registration has opened for the 32nd annual Peter McVerry Trust Wexford Cycle.

This year's cycle will be a hybrid event where participants will have the option to complete the traditional route from UCD to Wexford Town, or to take on a virtual cycle on the same date – Saturday, 18th September – and cycle your own way on

the day. We hope you, and some family, friends, work colleagues, or club members will mark this year's Wexford Cycle, either by joining us in Dublin, or by getting involved from wherever you are in Ireland, or further a field.

For those taking on the traditional event there are two route options – 100km or 135km. For our virtual participants, the distance you cycle is your choice. So, whether you cycle 10km, 50km, 100km, or 145km, you can do it anywhere, all while raising money in support of Peter McVerry Trust.
