Thurs. 9.30 am: Golden Book Fri. 9.30 am: Altar List of the Dead Saint Augustine of Hippo (Aurelius Augustinus, 354-430 CE) was the first major philosopher of the Christian era. He was the Bishop of Hippo Regius in Numidia during the waning years of the Roman Empire, and his most famous work, The City of God, described what he believed to be the cause of this decline. In his works, he also addressed such questions as the original sin or free will, and his ideas would have a profound effect not only during his lifetime but also on the development of the medieval church and, later on, on the theologians of the Protestant Reformation. He is recognized as a saint and a Doctor of the Church for his contribution to theology. Feast Day 28th August.

Pope Gregory I (Latin: *Gregorius I*; c. 540 – 12 March 604), commonly known as Saint Gregory the Great, was the bishop of Rome from 3 September 590 to his death. [1][a] He is known for instigating the first recorded large-scale mission from Rome, the Gregorian Mission, to convert the then-pagan Anglo-Saxons in England to Christianity. [2] Gregory is also well known for his writings, which were more prolific than those of any of his predecessors as pope. [3] The epithet Saint Gregory the Dialogist. A Roman senator's son and himself the prefect of Rome at 30, Gregory lived in a monastery he established on his family estate before becoming a papal ambassador and then pope. Although he was the first pope from a monastic background, his prior political experiences may have helped him to be a talented administrator. During his papacy, he greatly surpassed with his administration the emperors in improving the welfare of the people of Rome, and he challenged the theological views of Patriarch Eutychius of Constantinople before the emperor Tiberius II. Gregory regained papal authority in Spain and France and sent missionaries to England, including Augustine of <u>Canterbury</u> and <u>Paulinus of York</u>. The realignment of barbarian allegiance to Rome from their Arian Christian alliances shaped medieval Europe. Gregory saw Franks, Lombards, and Visigoths align with Rome in religion. He also combated the Donatist heresy, popular particularly in North Africa at the time. [4] His contributions to the development of the Divine Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts, still in use in the Byzantine Rite, were so significant that he is generally recognized as its de facto author.

Gregory is one of the <u>Latin Fathers</u> and a <u>Doctor of the Church</u>. He is considered a <u>saint</u> in the <u>Catholic Church</u>, <u>Eastern Orthodox Church</u>, <u>Anglican Communion</u>, various <u>Lutheran</u> denominations, and other <u>Protestant</u> denominations.
