

Tap and Go Contactless Donation

A choice as to how you donate



The Archdiocese of Dublin has introduced a "Tap and Go" contactless donation method to enable people to donate directly to the First Collection (Common Fund Priest Collection) and the Second Collection (Share Fund).

Card machines are in place at the back of the Church for this purpose.

Please note any donation through this method will be split 60% to the Common Fund & 40% to Share Fund

You can use your Debit/Credit Card or indeed your mobile phone if you it payments enabled on your phone. Donations by this method are anonymous for now.

Familiar collection bags and the current envelope system remain in place.

St. Camillus de Lellis, M.I.,

(25 May 1550 – 14 July 1614) was a Roman Catholic priest from Italy who founded the Camillians, a religious order dedicated to the care of the sick.



He was beatified by Pope Benedict XIV in 1742, and canonized in 1746.

An imposing man of six and half feet, de Lellis joined the army at a young age and fought against the Turks, but suffered a leg injury that brought him to a hospital in Rome. When he was sufficiently recovered, he worked as an orderly, but his quarrelsome manner resulted in his being returned to the battlefield. However, he succumbed to a gambling addiction, and ended up losing all of his money and military equipment. He found employment with an order of Capuchin monks. he was inspired by the religious influence of the monks and attempted to join the order, but was rejected due to his leg injury. the Capuchins sent him to an invalid hospital in Rome. It was there, among the sick, that his unique vocation began He petitioned them to employ him as a nurse. With his renewed spiritual state, he determined to reform the hospital's care. At the time, hospitals were essentially where people were sent to die: conditions were unsanitary and patients were often mistreated. Camillus revolutionized treatment, giving proper nutrition to the ailing, isolating contagious patients, and promoting cleanliness and fresh air, as well as showing the love of Christ to all he treated. Impressed by his work, the administrators made him superintendent of the hospital In 1584, Camillus was also ordained as a priest, and founded an order called the "Ministers of the Sick." The men of his order served the wounded of the battlefields of Hungary and Croatia, making them the first recorded ambulance corps.

Though he suffered from health problems himself, Camillus continued to serve the sick throughout his life, founding fifteen houses for his order and eight hospitals by the time of his death. The patron of the sick and healthcare workers, St. Camillus serves as an example of Christ-like care for the sick and less fortunate. By the end of his life in 1614, Camillus was renowned for his holiness, courage,
