CATECHETICAL CORNER – ARE YOU HAPPY OR CONTENT? Part 2

When our Blessed Mother, visited her cousin Elizabeth, Elizabeth exclaimed: "Blessed are you among all women and blessed is the fruit of your womb." (Lk.1:42) Mary was and is Blessed by GOD. We too have the opportunity to be Blessed. Jesus, has given us a 9-point plan (Mt. 5:3-12) that will lead to blessed-ness.

In Latin the word blessed is 'Beatus' from which we get Beatitude. Nine times in as many verses Jesus says: 'Blessed [Beatus] are you'! Blessed are you...the poor in spirit...the gentle...those who mourn...those who hunger and thirst for uprightness...the merciful...the pure in heart...the peacemakers...those who are persecuted in the cause of uprightness...those who are persecuted and falsely accused on account of Jesus...". Although Jesus concludes with: 'Rejoice and be glad for your reward will be great in heaven' (v. 12); when we reflect on the Beatitudes we see that they present us with us a plan, a road map, for how to live a truly happy life.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) says this: "The Beatitudes respond to the natural desire for happiness. This desire is of divine origin: God has placed it in the human heart in order to draw man to the One who alone can fulfill it." (CCC #1718)

Quoting St John Henry Cardinal Newman, the Catechism says this: "The Decalogue, the Sermon on the Mount [The Beatitudes], and the apostolic catechesis [the teaching of the Apostles] describe for us the paths that lead to the Kingdom of heaven. Sustained by the grace of the Holy Spirit, we tread them, step by step, by everyday acts. By the working of the Word of Christ, we slowly bear fruit in the Church to the glory of God." (CCC #1724)

The Catechism outlines the objective of this way of living, this Beatitude: "God put us in the world to know, to love, and to serve him, and so to come to paradise. Beatitude makes us "partakers of the divine nature" and of eternal life. With beatitude, man enters into the glory of Christ-and into the joy of the Trinitarian life." (CCC #1721)

So that's what on offer from GOD, but how do we achieve it? Well, thankfully the Catechism answers that for us: "The beatitude we are promised confronts us with decisive moral choices. It invites us to purify our hearts of bad instincts and to seek the love of God above all else. It teaches us that true happiness is not found in riches or well-being, in human fame or power, or in any human achievement...but in God alone, the source of every good and of all love." (CCC #1723) The Commandments and the Beatitudes call us to amend our life. To live, first and foremost, in right relationship with GOD but also with others.
