CATECHETICAL CORNER – ARE YOU HAPPY OR CONTENT?

Billy Connolly, the great Scottish comedian and entertainer was asked, some years ago, if he was happy. He replied by saying that when he changed the word happy to content he realized that he was happier than he thought he was. Sounds like a good way of looking at things. Except for Christians, and especially so for Catholics, we are destined for much more than mere contentment. We have been given a charter for complete and utter happiness.

This Charter for Happiness comes in two parts; the first is the Commandments. I know, we don't normally consider the commandments in this way, surely it is a set of "dos and don'ts"? It can be seen that way. Or, it can be seen as plan for living in right relationship with GOD and people, happiness.

The first three commandments relate to living in right relationship with GOD:

I am the LORD your God: You shall not have strange Gods before me – remove those things that get in the way of GOD, TV, scrolling, endless entertainment. You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain – How many times each day do we harm our relationship with GOD by misusing the name of GOD (Jesus)?

(Jesus)?
REMEMBER TO KEEP HOLY THE LORD'S DAY – give GOD priority, especially on Sunday.

So that is the first key to happiness, living in right relationship with GOD, getting our relationship with GOD right before worrying about our relationships with other people. As St Augustine famously said: "Our hearts are made for thee O GOD and our hearts are restless until they rest in Thee" Jesus put it another way: "I have come that you may have life and have it to the full." Jn.10:10. So we can't be happy, truly happy, until we are happy in GOD.

The second key to happiness is living in right relationship with the world and those around us. Having focused on GOD first, the remaining seven commandments relate to living in right relationship with each other, beginning with our parents.

HONOUR YOUR FATHER AND YOUR MOTHER – live in right relationship with your family.

YOU SHALL NOT KILL – consider the ways that we can 'kill or harm others

YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY – human sexuality is one of GOD's greatest gifts and should not be misused. YOU SHALL NOT STEAL – living an honest life.

YOU SHALL NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS AGAINST YOUR NEIGHBOUR — is it ever helpful to talk about someone else, even if it's true? What about when it's not true?

YOU SHALL NOT COVET YOUR NEIGHBOUR'S WIFE – wanting what others have is a sure fire recipe for unhappiness.

YOU SHALL NOT COVET YOUR NEIGHBOUR'S GOODS – do we really need more stuff? Acquiring/ desiring more 'stuff' is harming the earth, 'our common home' as Pope Francis called it.

Next week we will look at the second part of the Charter for Happiness, which is found in Chapter 5 of Matthew's Gospel.
