## **Athy Parish Centre**

Kildare County Council has granted planning permission for the renovations and change of use for the Athy Parish Centre. The building was formerly used as a Resource Centre and school. As well as making the building wheelchair accessible by the inclusion of a new access ramp and wheelchair accessible toilets, the renovations will involve some internal alterations.

While awaiting the granting of planning permission, the community part of the building has been developed over the last year. Slaintecare are renting the two prefabs behind the building. Kildare Travellers Association, Athy Photographic Society, Childcare Solutions are also renting rooms. The building is also being used by Anchor Youth Club, Irish dancing classes, art classes, the Knitting Group and various parish groups. Conor McCann, the Parish Pastoral Worker has his office there.

Again, we thank the Sisters of Mercy for their wonderful gift to the Parish of Athy. Now that planning permission has been granted, we hope to continue to develop the building for the benefit of the parish and the wider community

#### CATECHETICAL CORNER - SPIRITUAL FATHERHOOD

In the Gospel of Matthew chapter 23, verse 9 we read: '...call no man on earth your father for you have only one Father in heaven...'. So why then do we call our priests "Father" and should we stop? Perhaps we should follow the example of non-Roman Catholic Christians and use the term pastor or perhaps Reverend? He was using exaggeration to show the scribes and Pharisees how sinful and proud they were for not looking humbly to God as the source of all authority and fatherhood and teaching, and instead setting themselves up as the ultimate authorities, father figures, and teachers. He was doing the same thing when He said: 'if your eye causes you to sin pluck it out or if right hand causes you to sin cut it off.' (Mt.5:29-30). The second is to consider what He means about GOD alone to any human being. That does not mean that we not call people father, in either the biological sense or the spiritual sense. The Bible is full of references to what is called Spiritual Fatherhood. Joseph (he of the multi coloured coat) saw himself as a father to Pharaoh (Gen.45:8); Job was a 'father... to the House of Judah' (Isa.25:21).

In the New Testament, Ss. Peter, Paul and John all refer to themselves as spiritual fathers. Example; St Peter: '...so does my son Mark.' (1 Pet. 5:13). St Paul: 'For I became your father through Christ Jesus in the Gospel.' (1 Cor. 4:14-15). St John refers to: 'My little children...' (1 Jn. 2:1). So what does it mean to be a spiritual father? A human father provides for his family, he nurtures and educates his family, he defends, protect, and corrects or disciplines his family when needed. A priest provides for his spiritual family by making the sacraments available especially the Holy Eucharist. A priest nurtures and educates his spiritual family by teaching. A priest defends and protects his spiritual family keeping them safe from the attacks of the enemy, the Devil. And he corrects and disciplines when we, the family, go astray to false teaching or false gods.

In the Bible the concept of fatherhood is not restricted to just our earthly fathers and God. It is used to refer to people other than biological or legal fathers, and is used as a sign of respect to those with whom we have a special relationship. Since the Bible frequently speaks of this spiritual fatherhood, we Catholics acknowledge it and follow the custom of the apostles by calling pastors/priests "father." Failure to acknowledge this is a failure to recognise and honour a great gift God has bestowed on the Church: the spiritual fatherhood of the priesthood. (Sources include: 'Call no man your father.'
