#### CATECHETICAL CORNER – THE TRINITY.

It can be difficult to make sense of the Most Blessed Trinity. St Patrick used a Shamrock to try and explain it – three leaves but one plant. St Joseph of Cupertino used a blanket with three folds in it: three folds, one blanket. Our national flag, the Tricolour, might be another way; three distinct colours - one flag! But still none of those attempts really explain what the Holy Trinity is. To put it simply, the Trinity is a relationship of love.

"God is love" (1 Jn. 4:7 & 16). But for love to have any meaning it must have an 'object'. We don't just say 'I love.' We say; 'I love...you, I love...chocolate, I love...reading'. These are the 'objects' of our love. The Son – Who became Incarnate - the second person of the Trinity is the 'object' of the love of the Father. So too, the Father, the first person of the Trinity, is the object of the love of the Son. The Father loves the Son, the Son loves the Father. It is a mutual outpouring, a self-emptying of love, one for the other. So, the Father is both the lover and the beloved, so too the Son, is both the lover and the beloved. Their love flows from one to the other in an infinite outpouring of love. This love flowing from one to the other is what we call the Holy Spirit, the Holy Spirit is the fruit of the love flowing from Father to Son and Son to Father. That is why we say in the Creed, "I believe in the Holy Spirit...who proceeds from the Father and the Son...

It is from this relationship of love that the Church draws her understanding of Sacramental Marriage and human sexuality. It is why the Church exalts human sexuality in marriage to such a high degree. The Church's understanding of human sexuality is not negative, rooted in sin and shame but rather, it is almost divine. The Church understands the marriage relationship as being the closest thing to the relationship of the Most Holy Trinity that we can encounter in this life. It is an expression of the mutual self-giving that we see in the Trinity that the Church sees in the marriage relationship. The wife, loving and being loved in return. The husband, loving and being loved in return. The fruit of the love that flows from one to the other, the outpouring of selfemptying love, being an openness to children. (See the Catechism of the Catholic Church 2260 – 2279)

It is this total self-giving, self-sacrificing love, that we see in the Trinity and in marriage. 'A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life...for his wife'. To love in this way is to be Trinitarian. To understand this love is to understand the Trinity.

100th Anniversary of the Death of the Venerable Matt Talbot, 7th June 2025, Matt Talbot - Apostle of Hope,

Extract from the Homily of Archbishop Dermot Farrell "A man who came to know the darkness and the depths to which addiction can bring the person. Born in the poverty of Dublin's inner city, Matt Talbot began drinking at twelve years of age and became a chronic alcoholic. After sixteen years, aged 28, he decided to 'kick the habit'. In the mystery of his life, the Lord had knocked on Matt's door, and his turning to his Lord, 'the Way, the Truth and the Life' (John 14:6), became the way for him to fight, and overcome, his addition. His rediscovery of his Lord and his active participation in the life of the Church—some might use the word 'conversion,' his turning to prayer, his reconnection with the Eucharist and the community that gathered for it, were central to his recovery. We are reminded that the spiritual and the physical dimensions of the person go handin-hand in the renewal and rebuilding of life. Matt once said to his sister, "Never think harshly of a person because of the drink. It is easier to get out of hell than it is to give up the drink." He then continued, "For me, it was only possible with the help of God and our Blessed Mother." Matt's life became one of prayer, penance, fasting and acts of charity. His journey to recovery was also a journey to the heart of what the Church and our mission is: a witness to the power of Christ for us and in us, a service of others—especially the
