Archbishop Farrell addresses racial attacks on the Indian Community

The Archbishop of Dublin, Dermot Farrell, addresses recent racial attacks on the Indian community in Dublin, condemning such behaviour as unacceptable and harmful to society. He highlights the significant contributions of the Indian community and other minorities to Ireland, particularly in healthcare, the economy, and the Church. The Archbishop calls for solidarity, justice, and equality, urging parishes to welcome and support minority communities. He encourages practical steps, such as engaging with affected families, supporting law enforcement, countering misinformation, and ensuring diversity in parish councils and ministries. The letter emphasizes gratitude for the contributions of minority communities and the Christian duty of hospitality and inclusion.

Augustine of Hippo (13 November 354 – 28 August 430) was a theologian and philosopher of Berber origin and the bishop of Hippo Regius in Numidia, Roman North Africa. His writings deeply influenced the development of Western philosophy and Western Christianity, and he is viewed as one of the most important Church Fathers of the Latin Church in the Patristic Period. His many important works include *The City* of God, On Christian Doctrine, and Confessions. After his conversion to Christianity and baptism in 386, Augustine developed his own approach to philosophy and theology, accommodating a variety of methods and perspectives. Believing the grace of Christ was indispensable to human freedom, he helped formulate the doctrine of original sin and made significant contributions to the development of just war theory. When the Western Roman Empire began to disintegrate, Augustine imagined the Church as a spiritual City of God, distinct from the material Earthly City. Augustine is recognized as a saint in the Catholic Church, the Eastern Orthodox Church, the <u>Lutheran churches</u>, and the <u>Anglican Communion</u>. He is also a preeminent Catholic <u>Doctor of the Church</u> and the patron of

the Augustinians.

His **Feast Day is celebrated on 28 August**, the day of his death. Augustine is the <u>patron saint</u> of brewers, printers, theologians, and a number of cities and dioceses.
